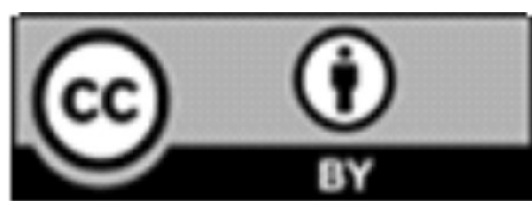
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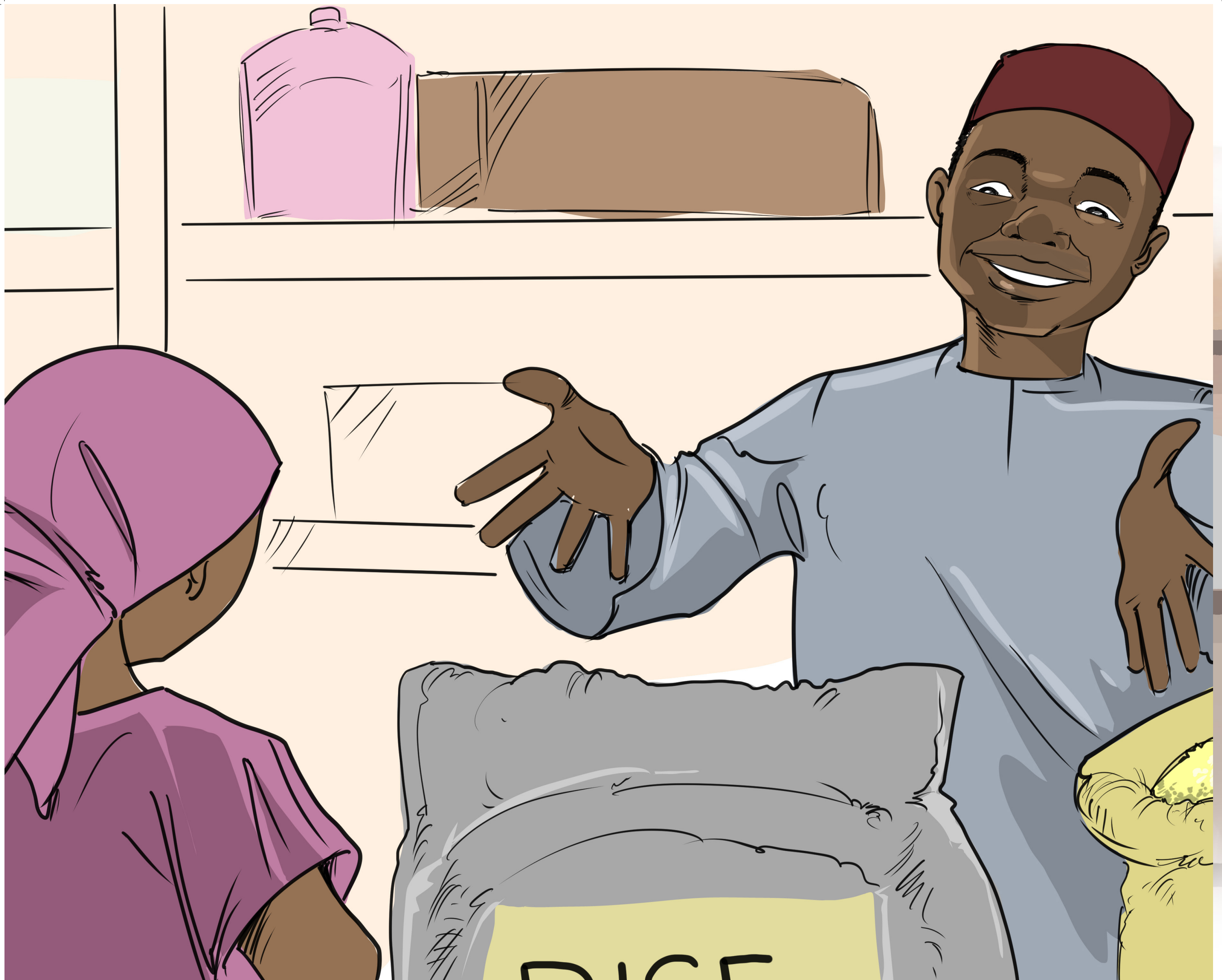
Father has a shop in the market.



Today is market day.



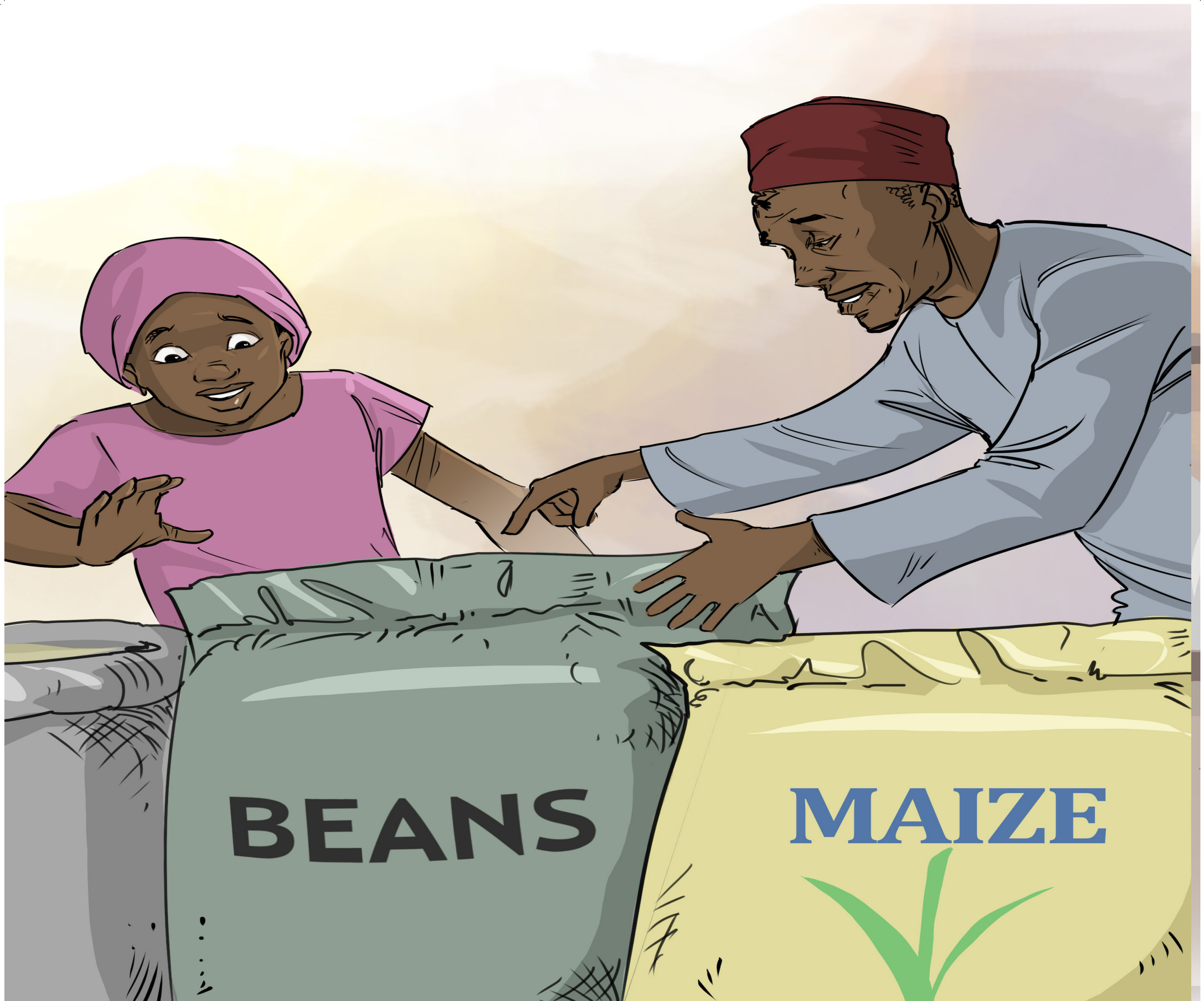
People will buy rice, beans

Father says.



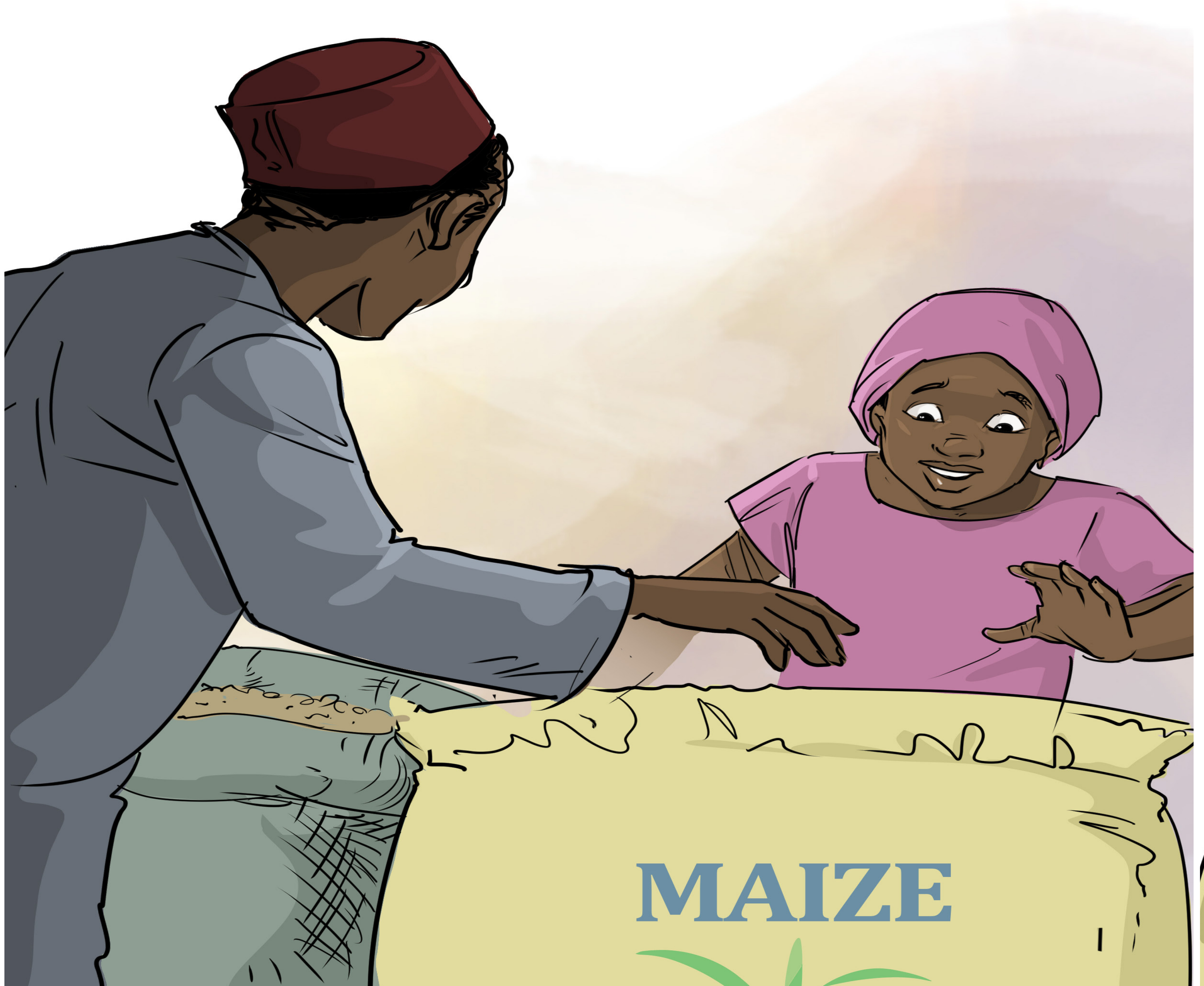
“Mice! Mice!” I shout.
“Mice are in the rice!”



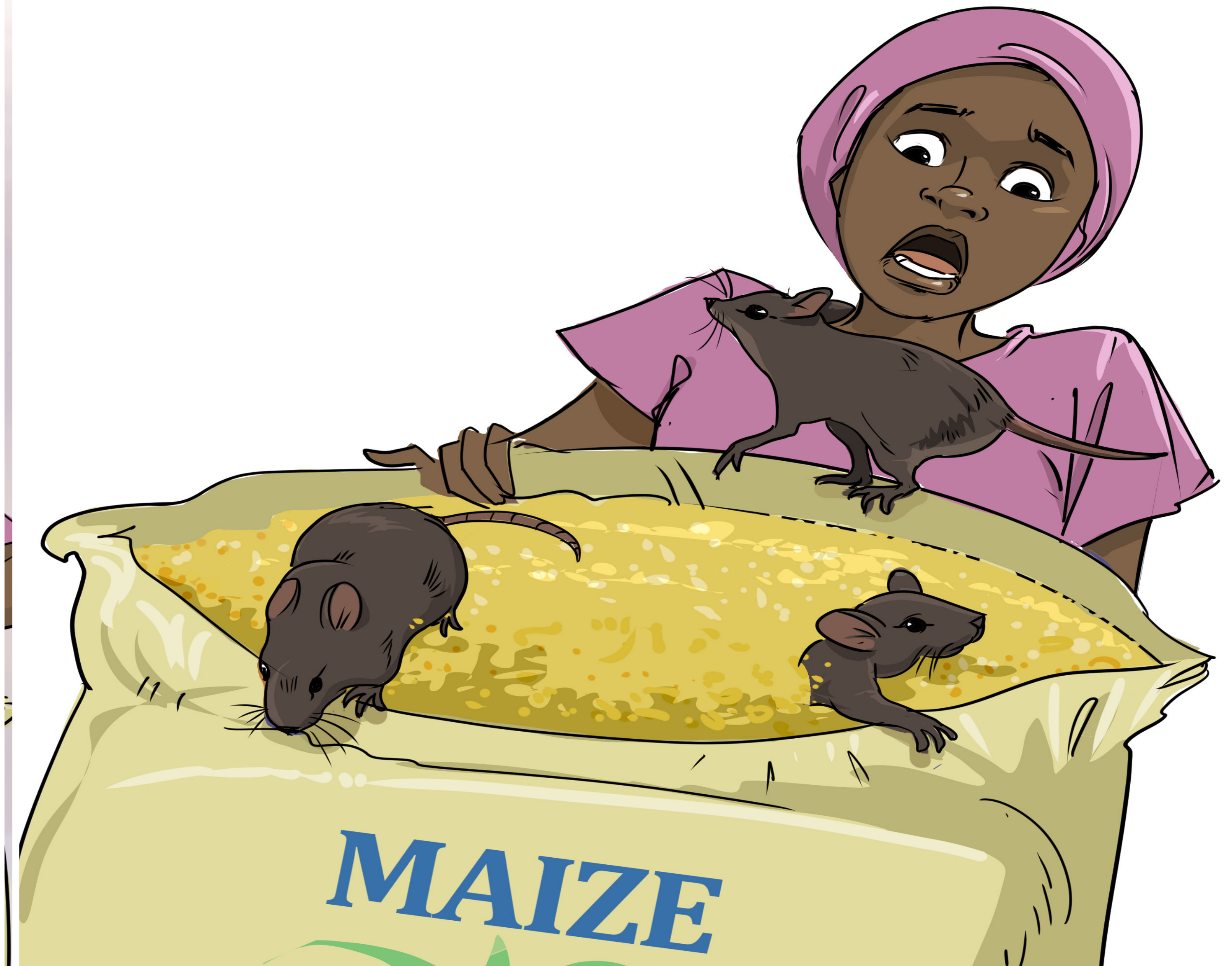
“Open the bag of beans,”

“Mice are in the beans!”



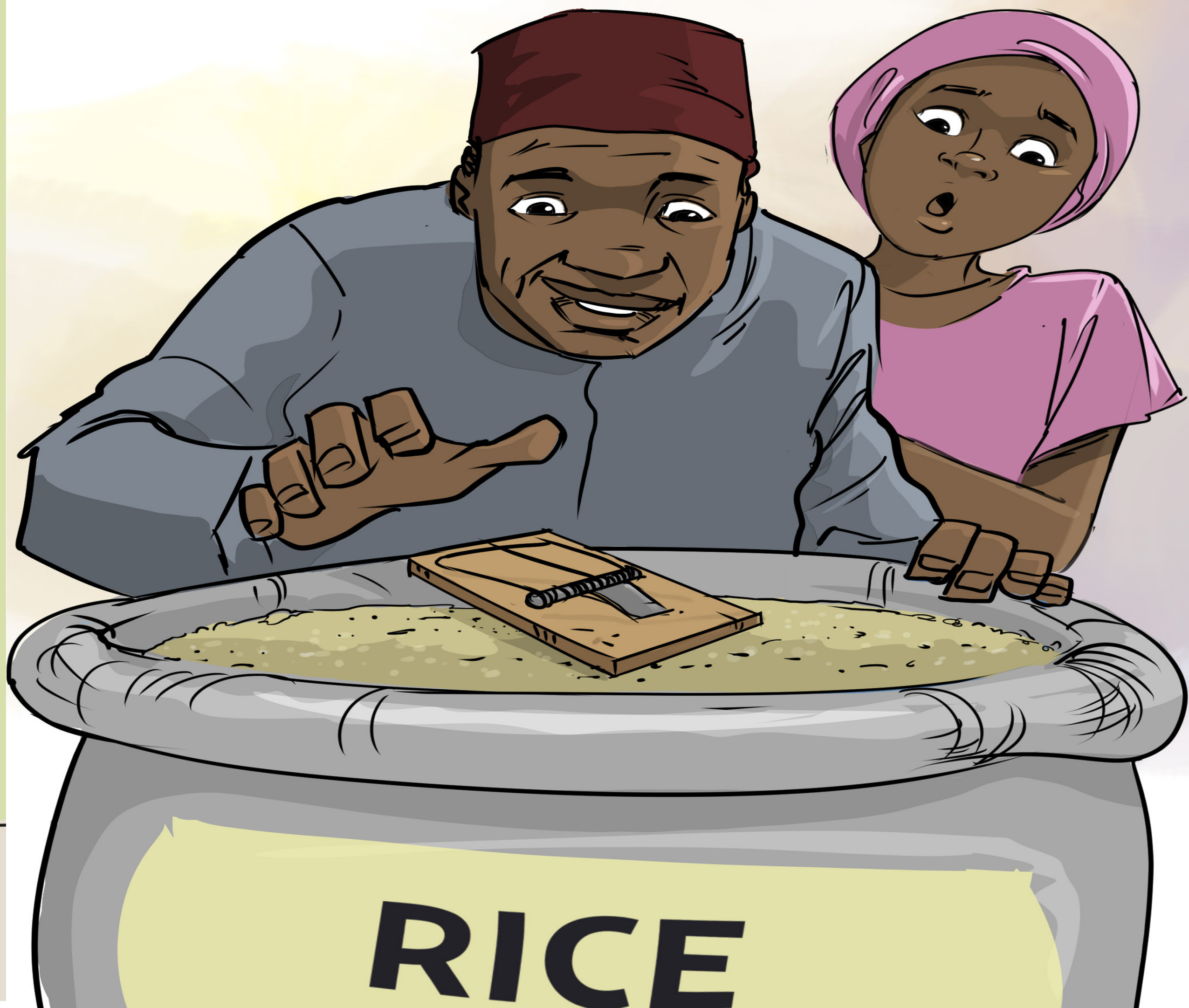
“Open the bag of maize,”

“I will put this trap in the beans,” he says.



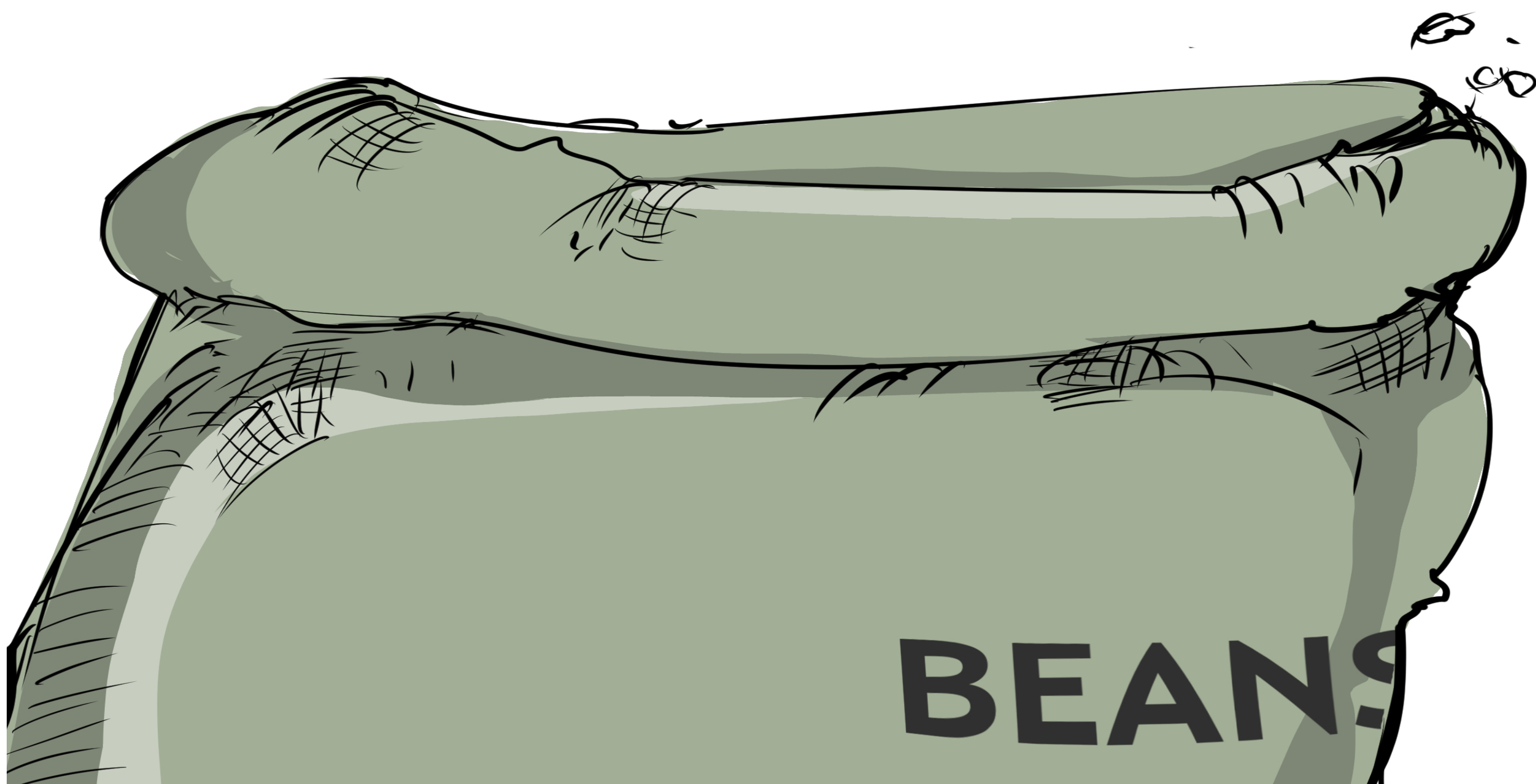
“I will put this trap in the maize,” he says.

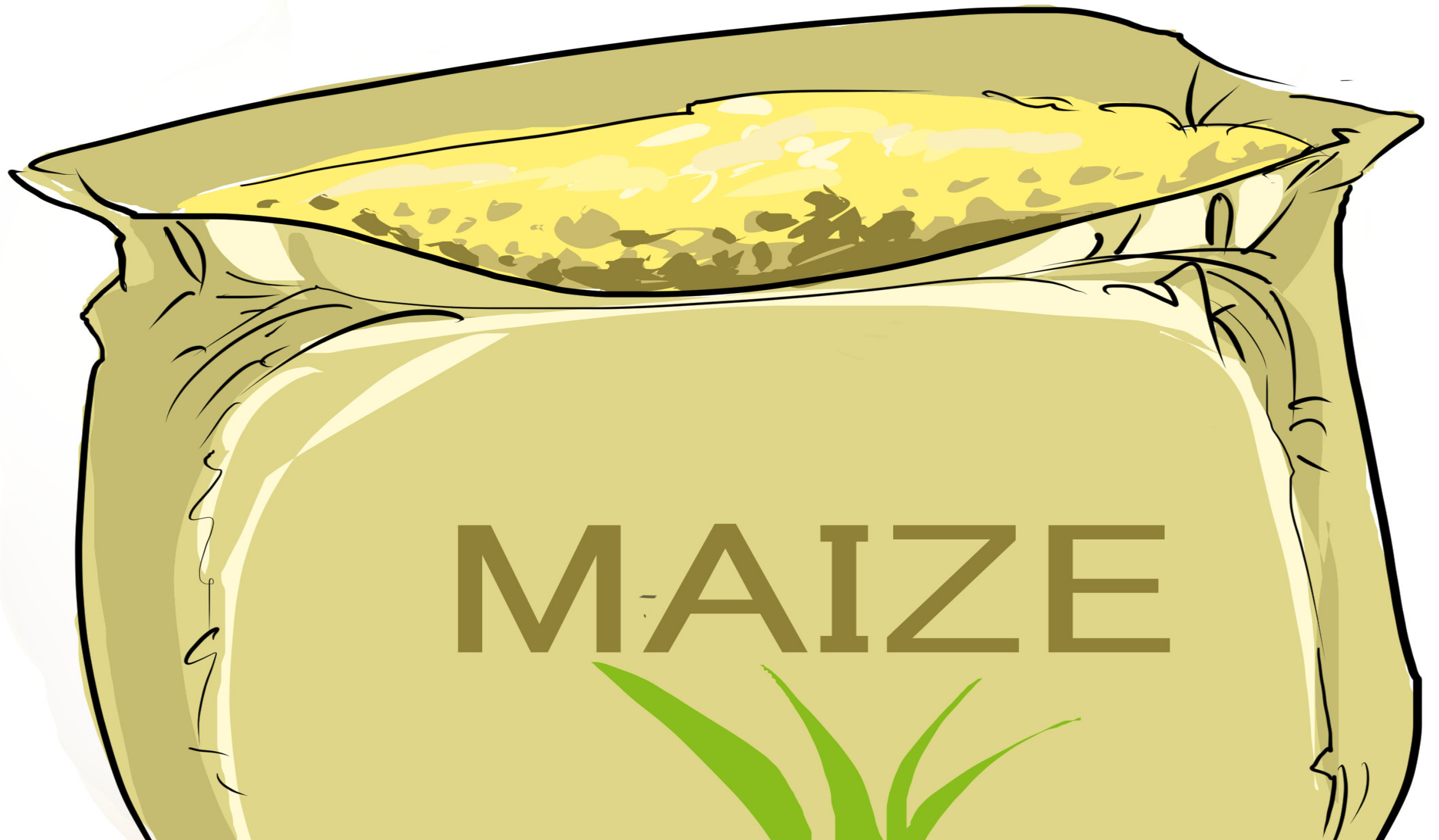

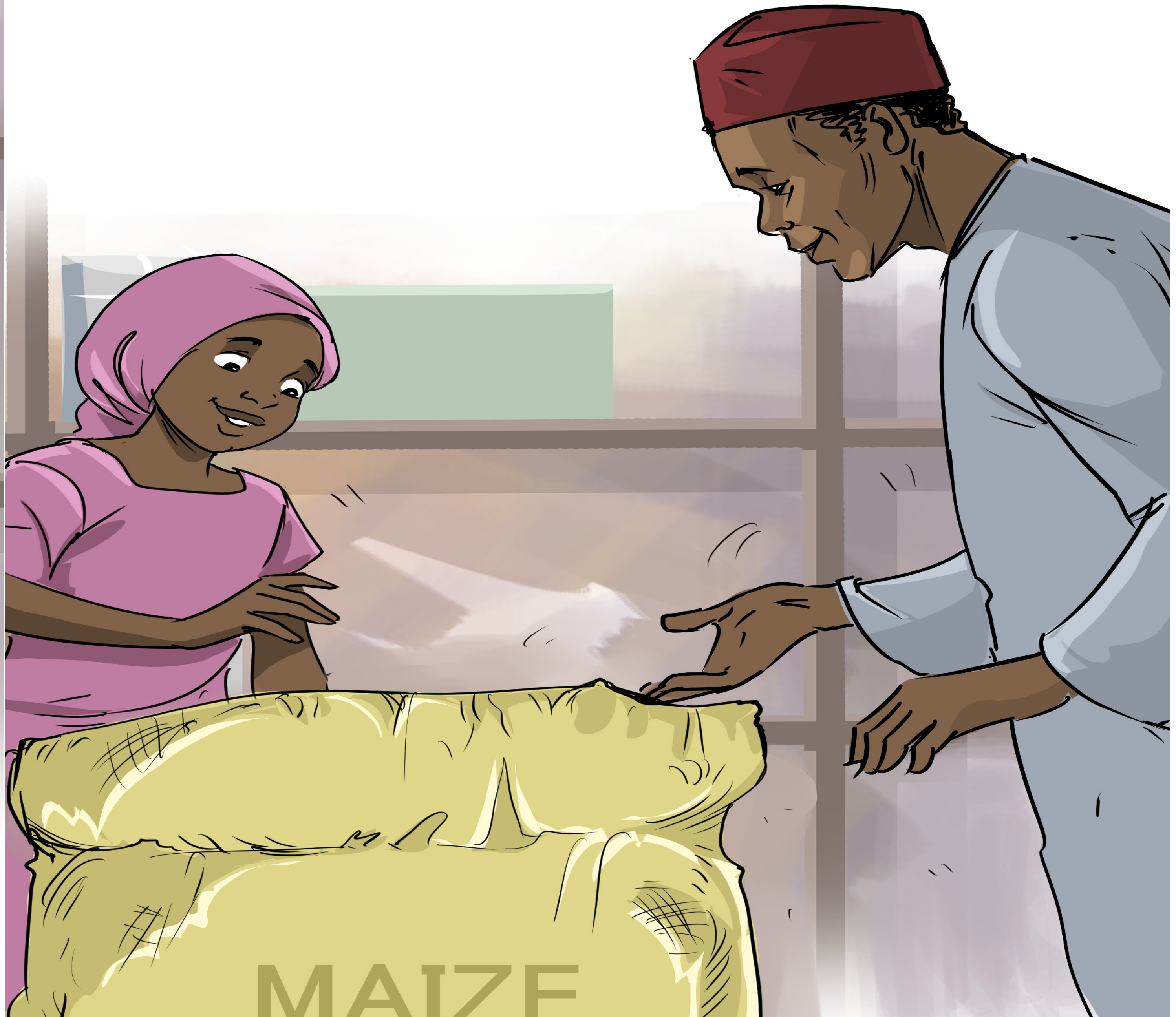

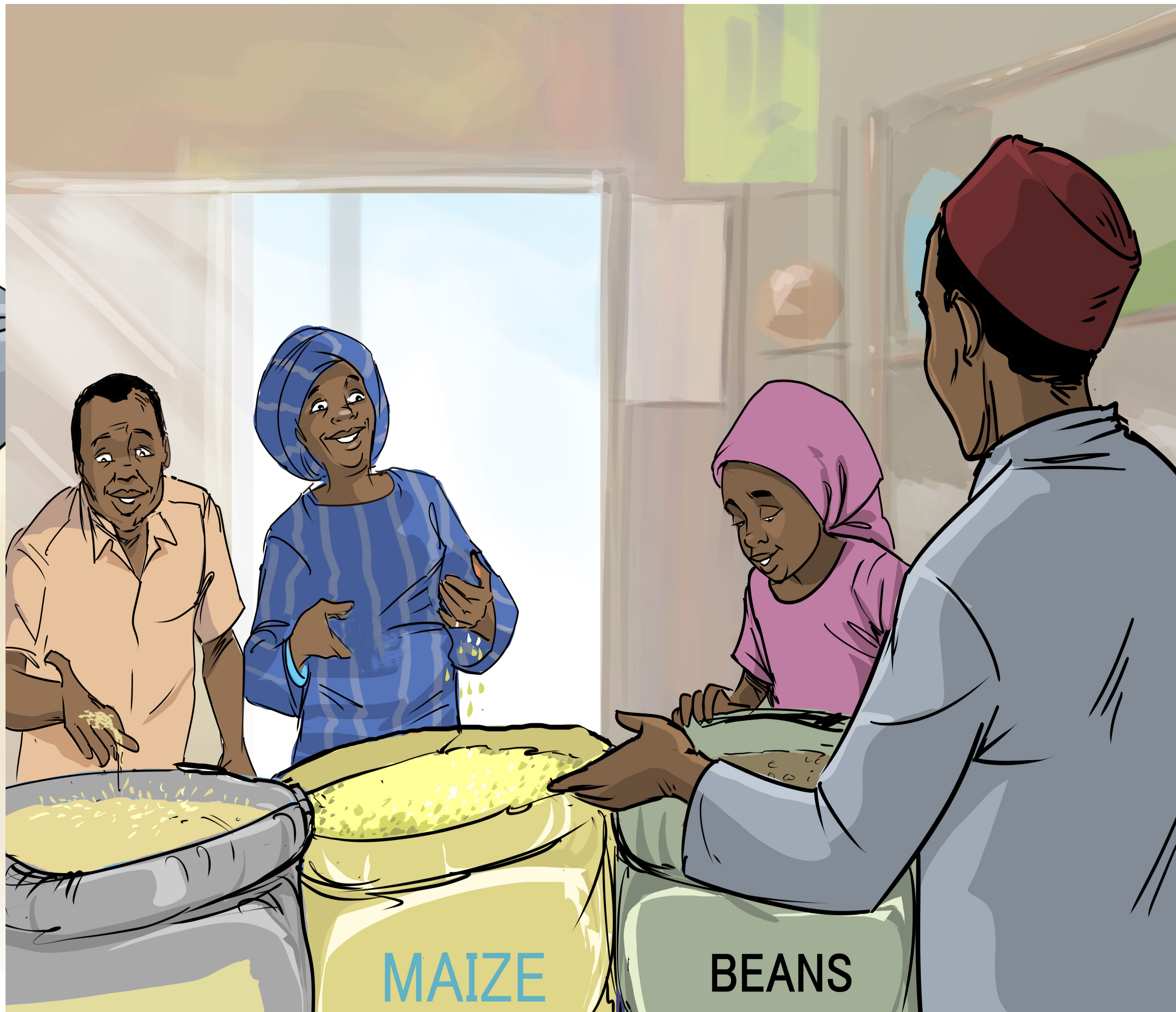
