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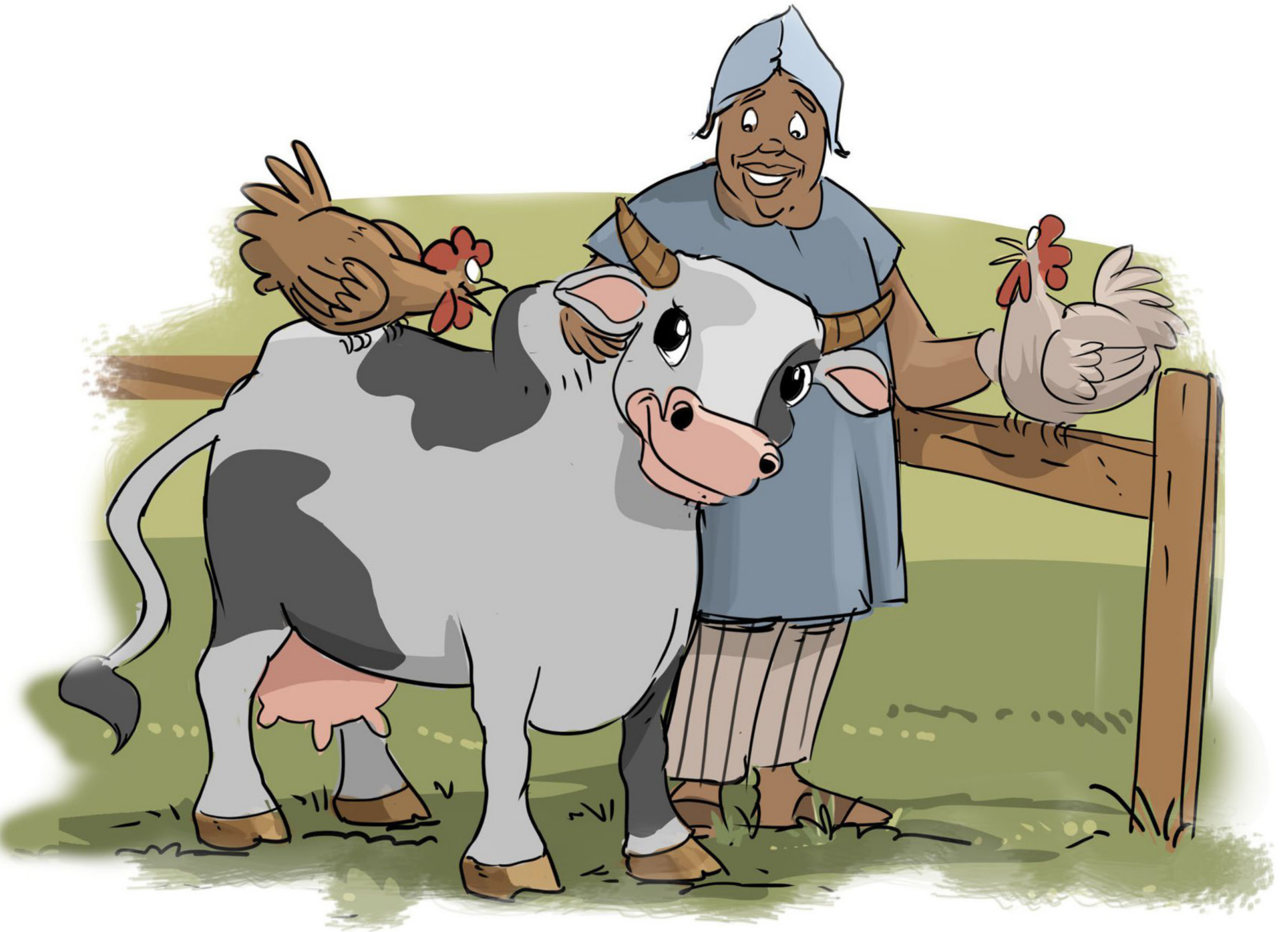


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Once upon a time, there
was a good farmer.



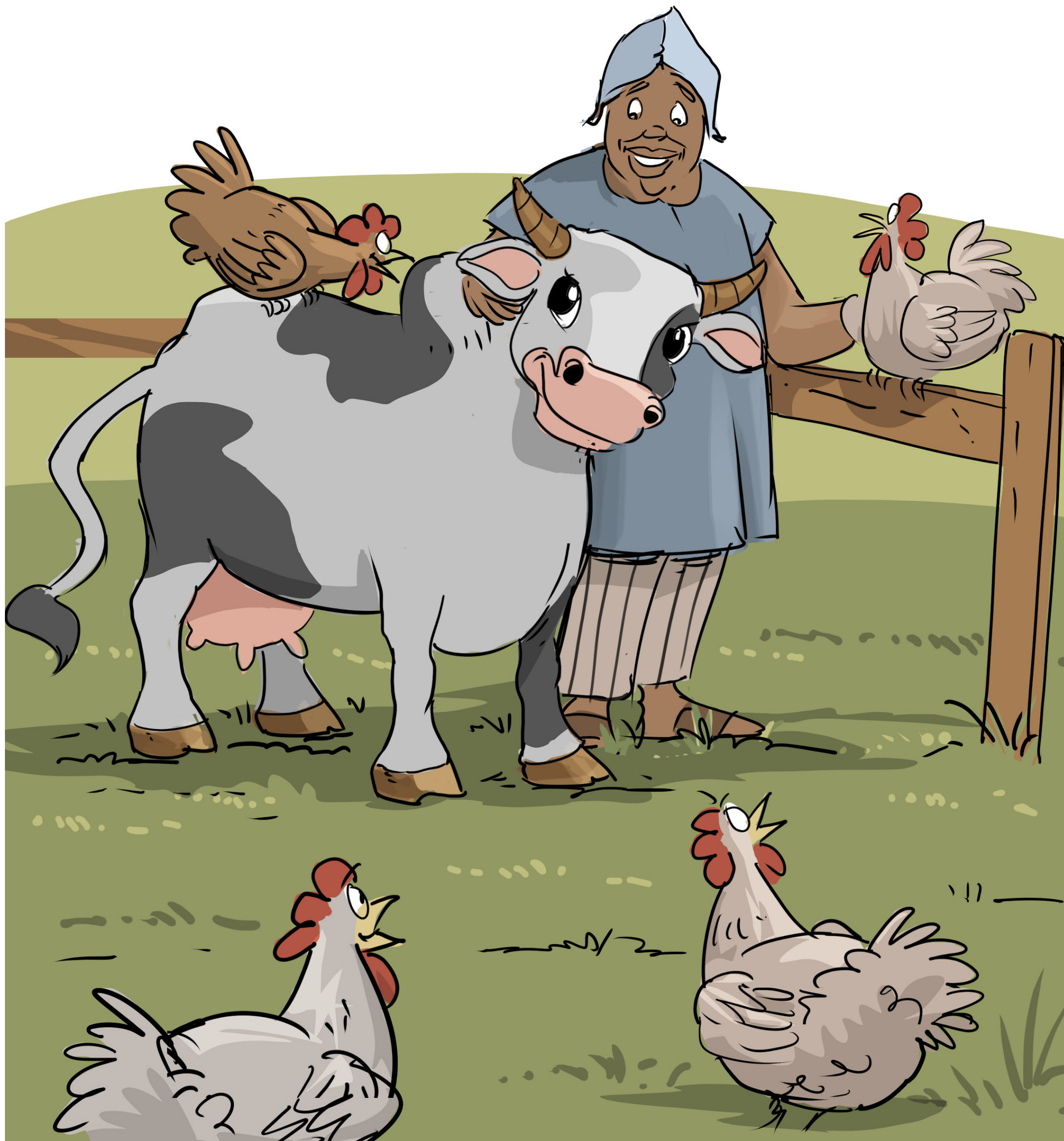
The farmer had a cow
and chickens.



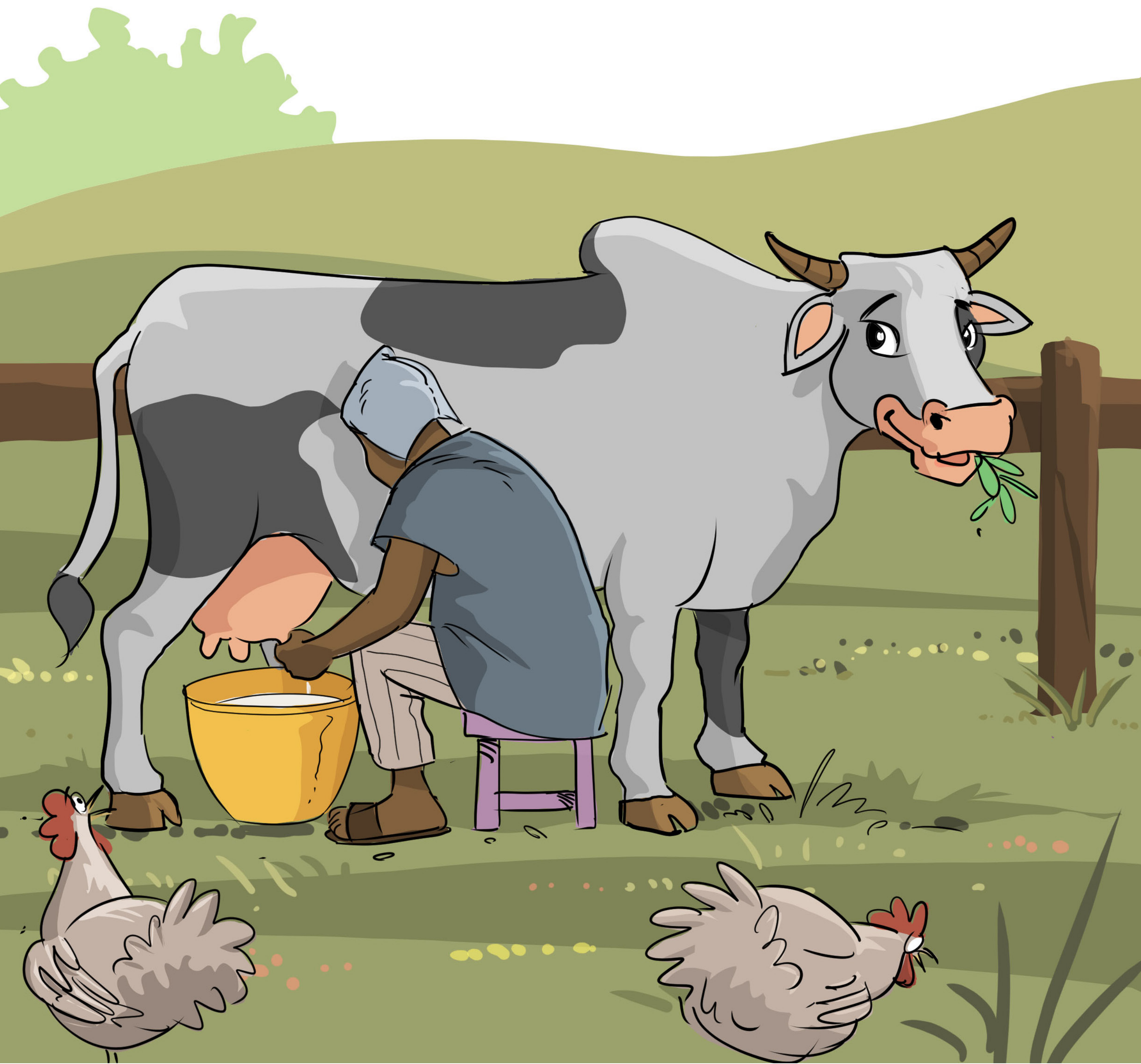
Every day, the farmer gave cool water to the animals.



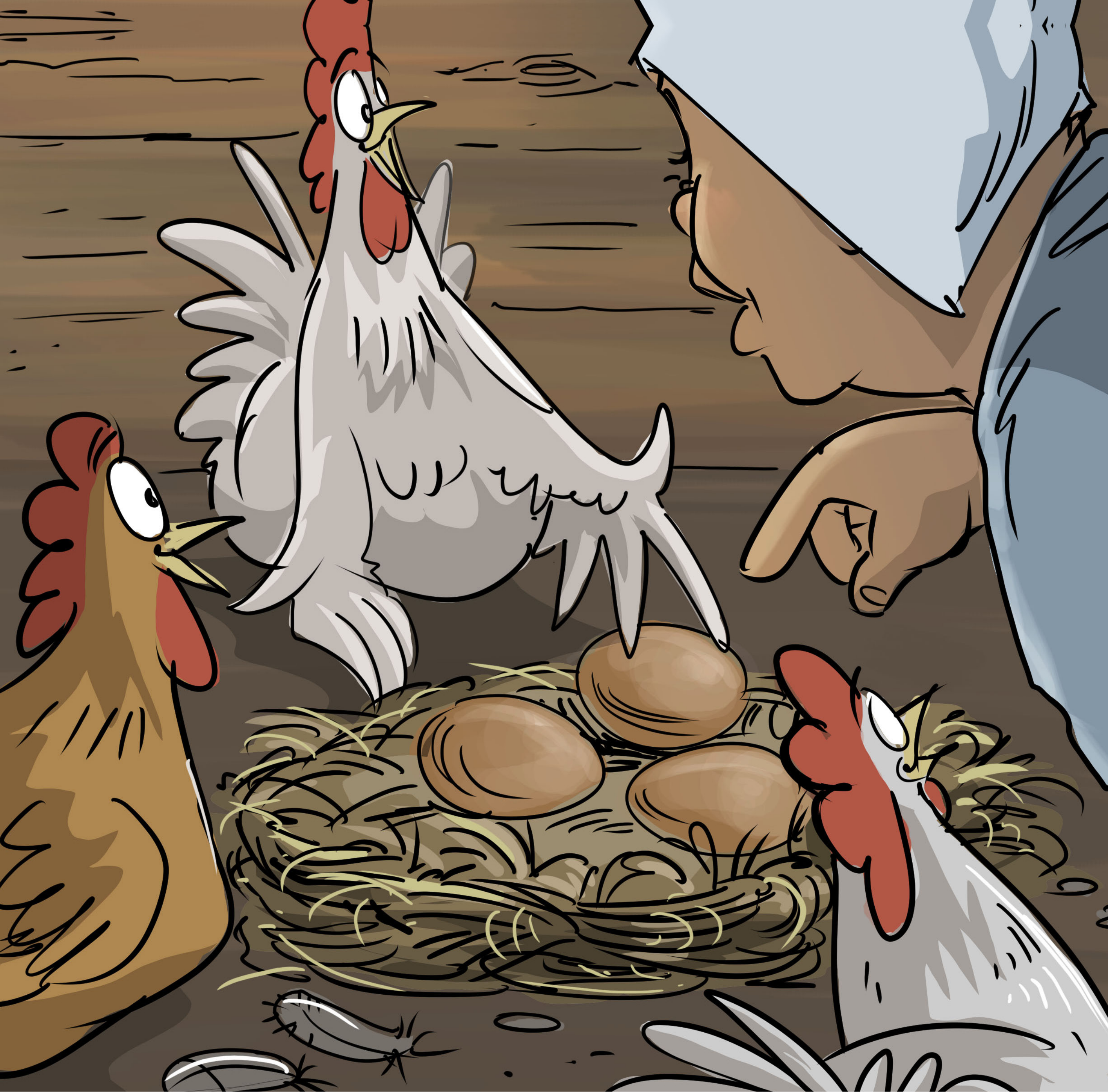
He gave sweet yams

to the chickens.



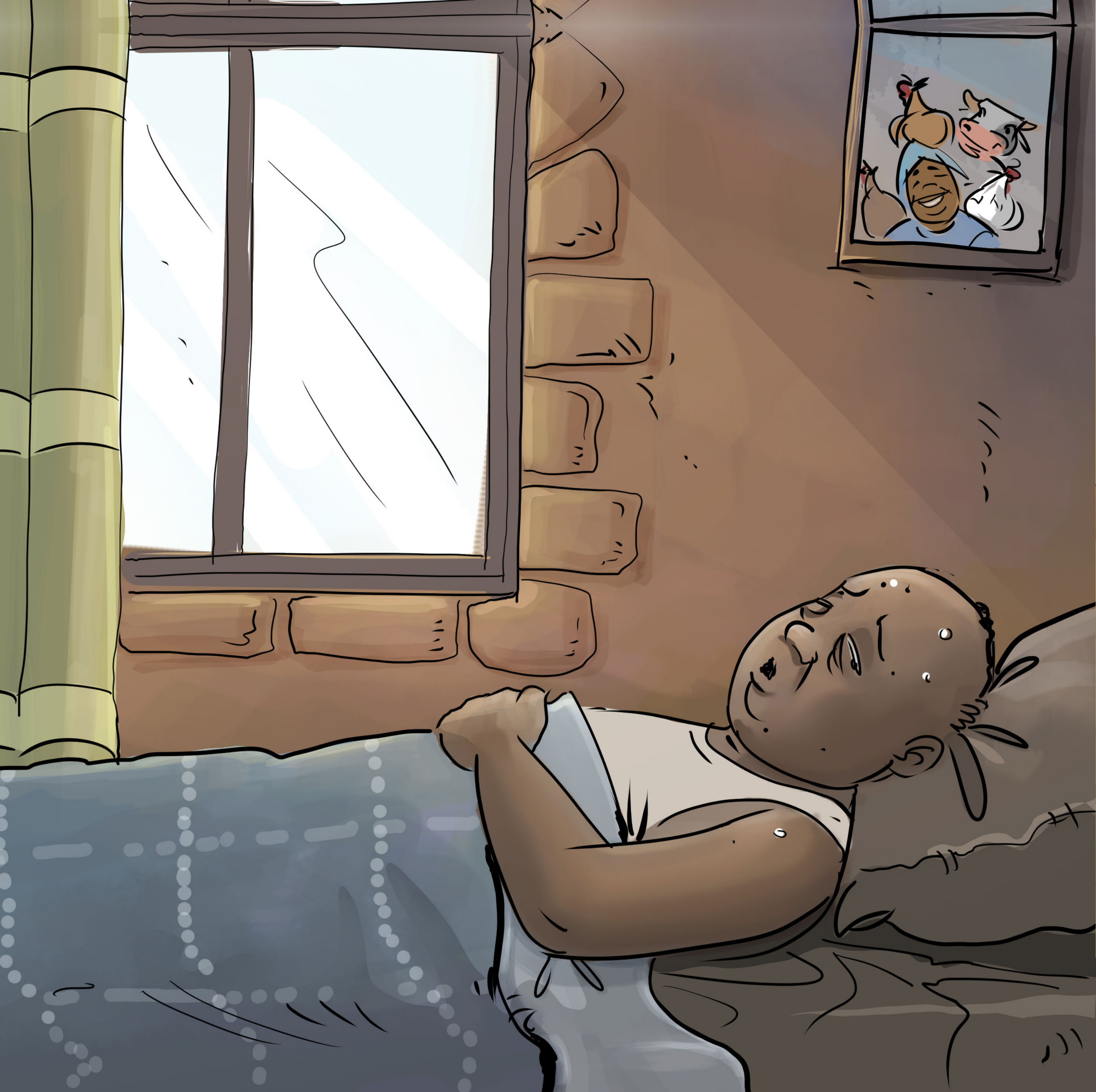
The animals loved the farmer.



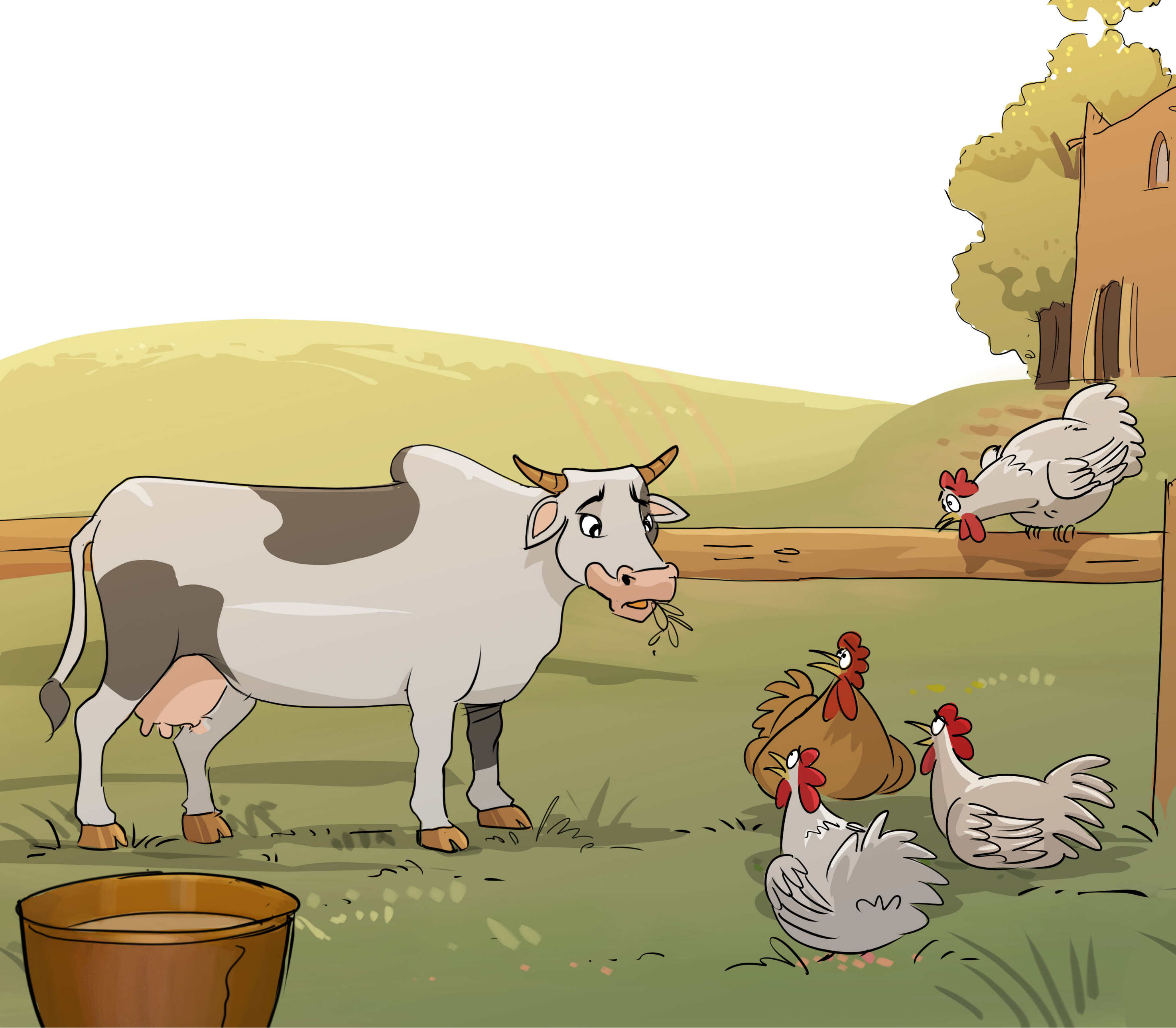
The cow gave him milk.

eggs.



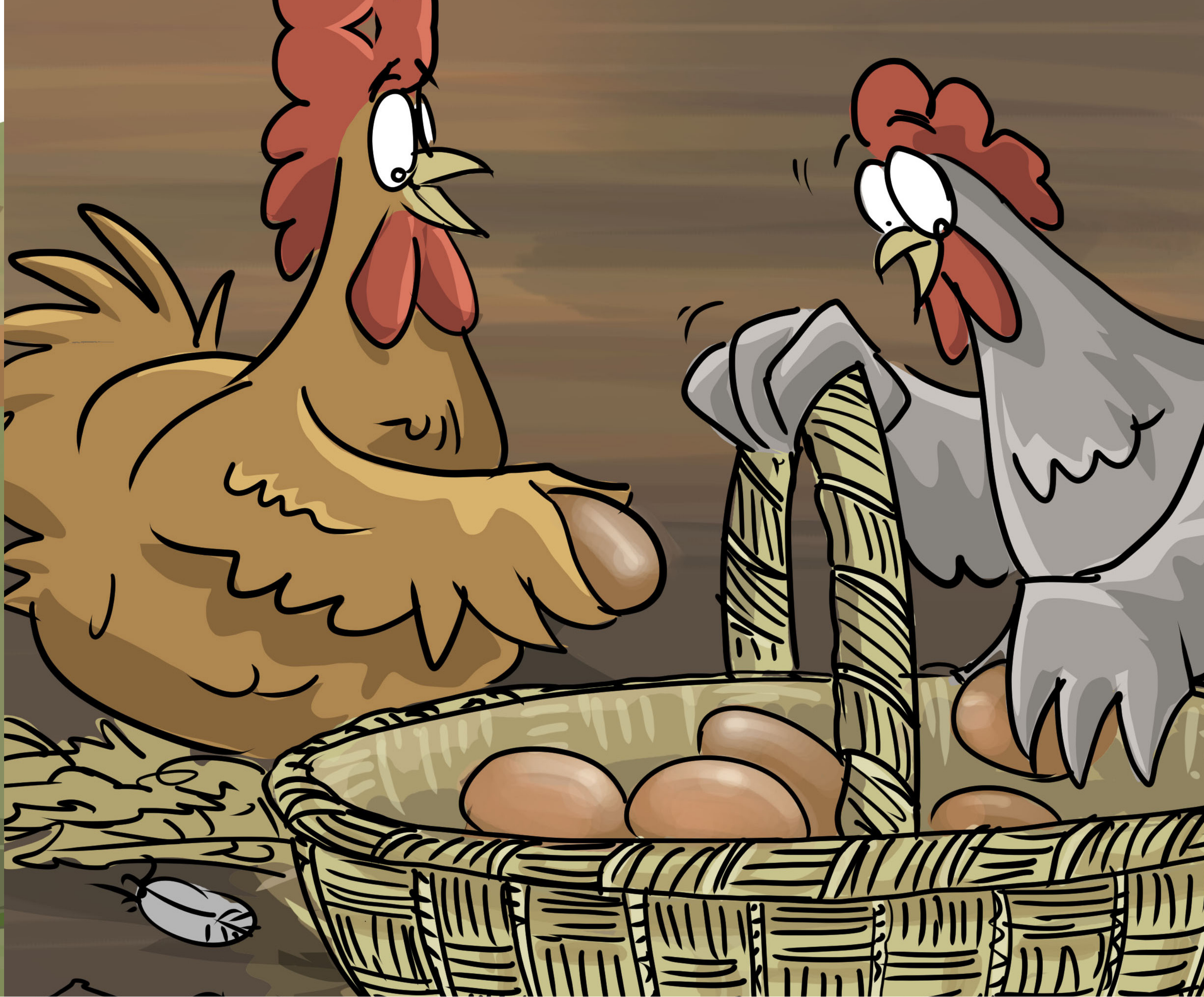
One day, the farmer
fell sick.



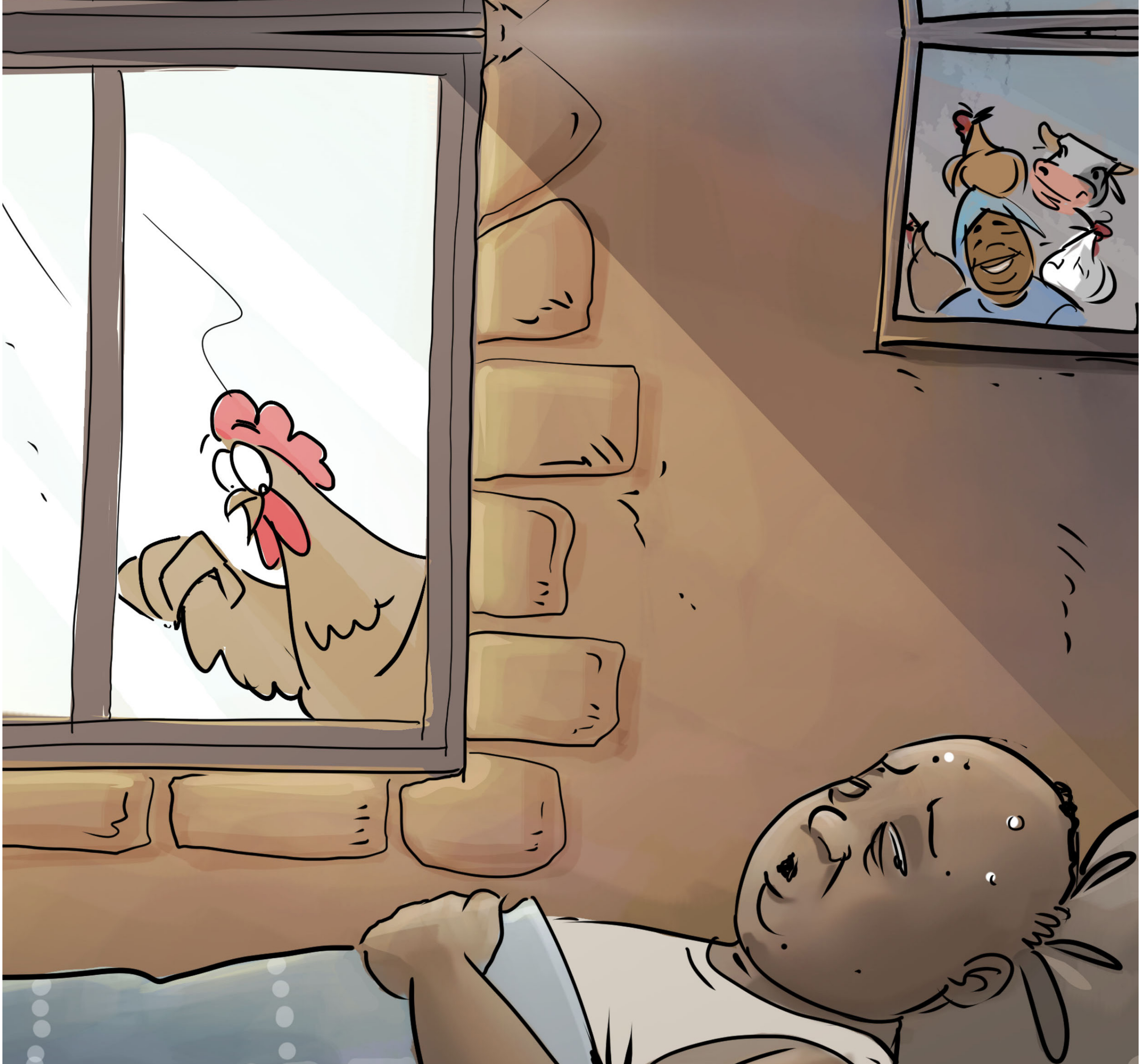
“We must help the farmer,” the cow said.
“He is so good to us.”



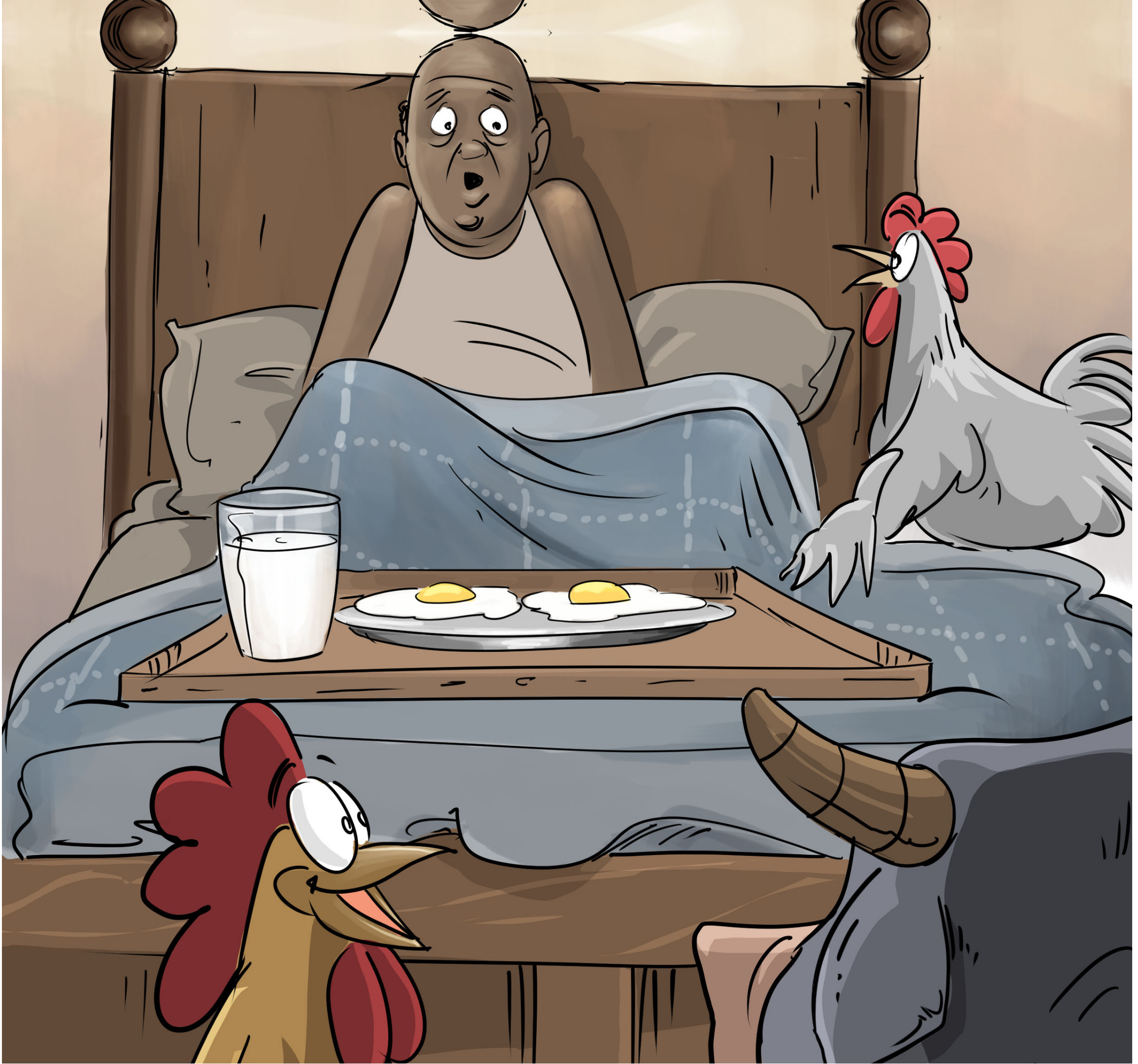
The cow put milk in the bucket.



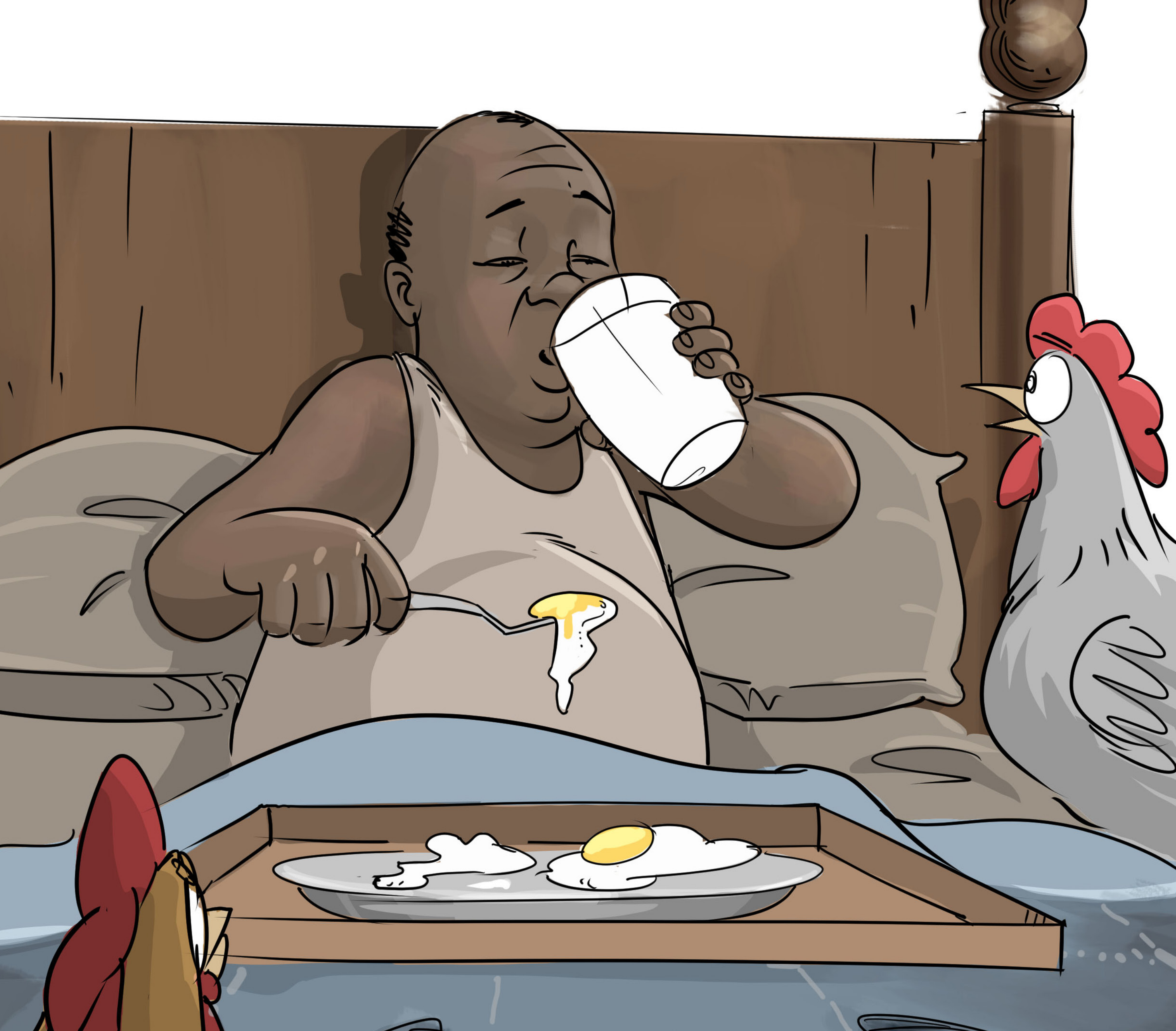
The chickens put eggs

The chickens climbed up and tapped on the bedroom window where the farmer was sleeping.



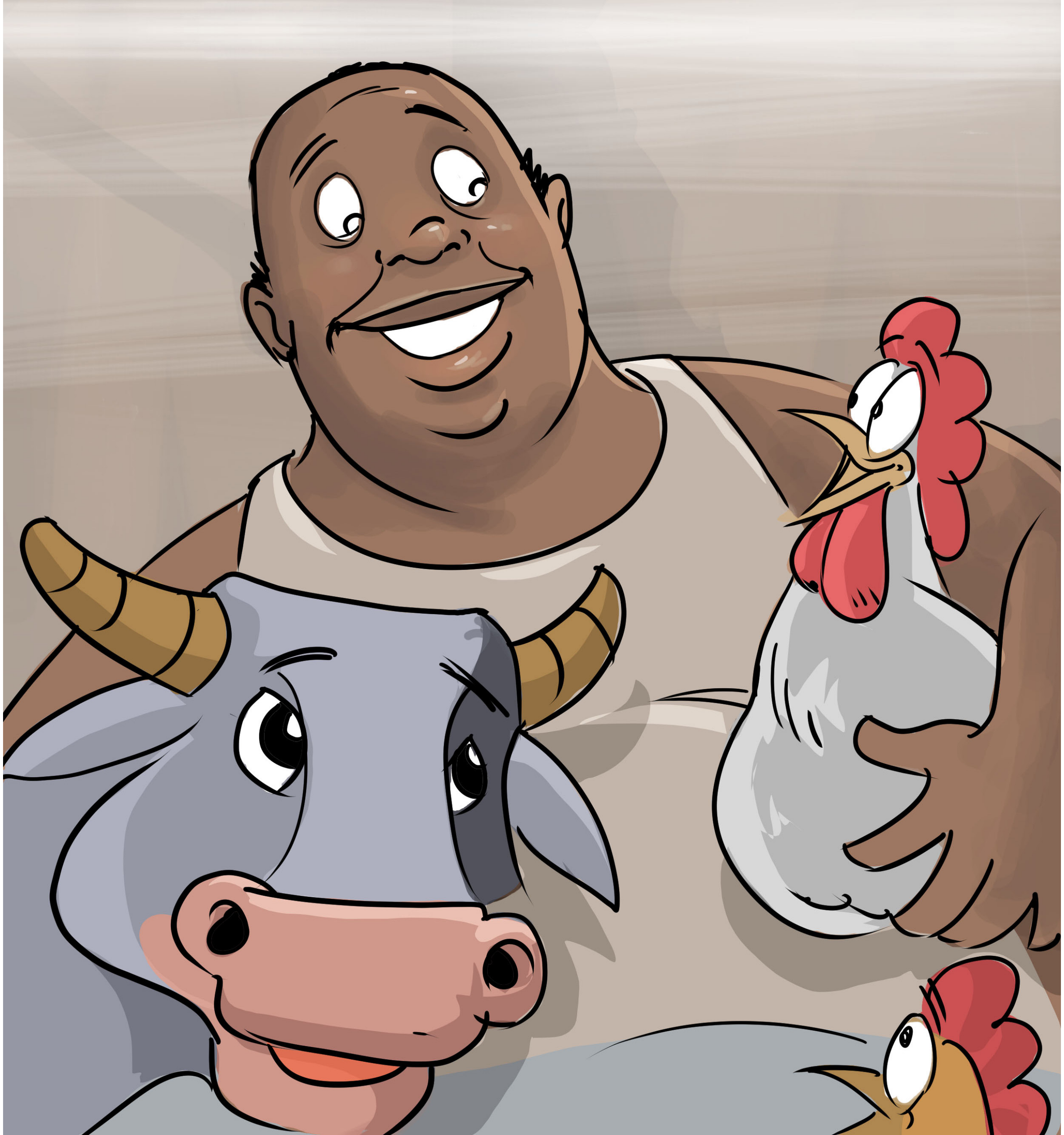
When the farmer woke up, he could not believe his eyes. “What is happening?” he said.
