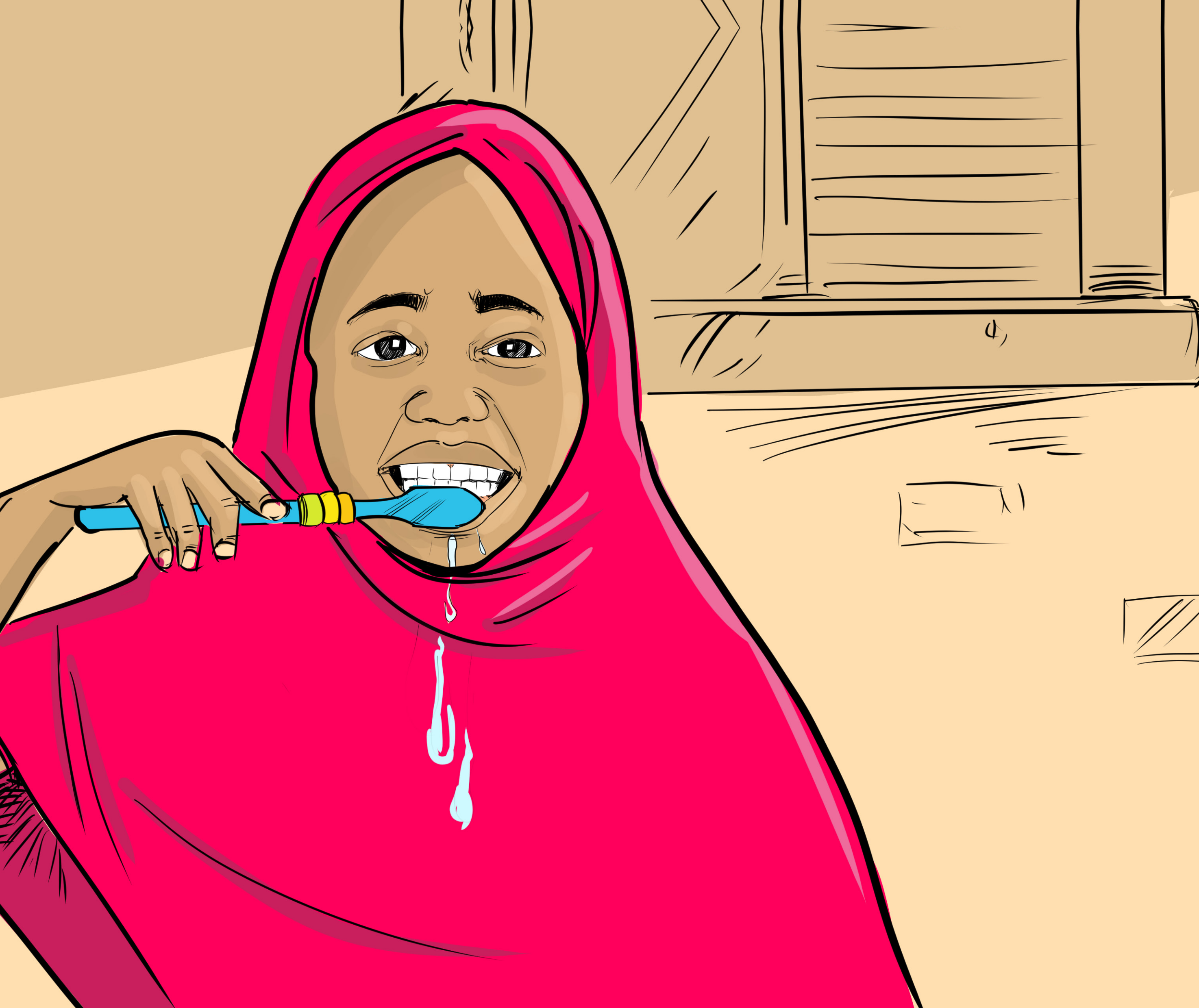
I open my eyes.



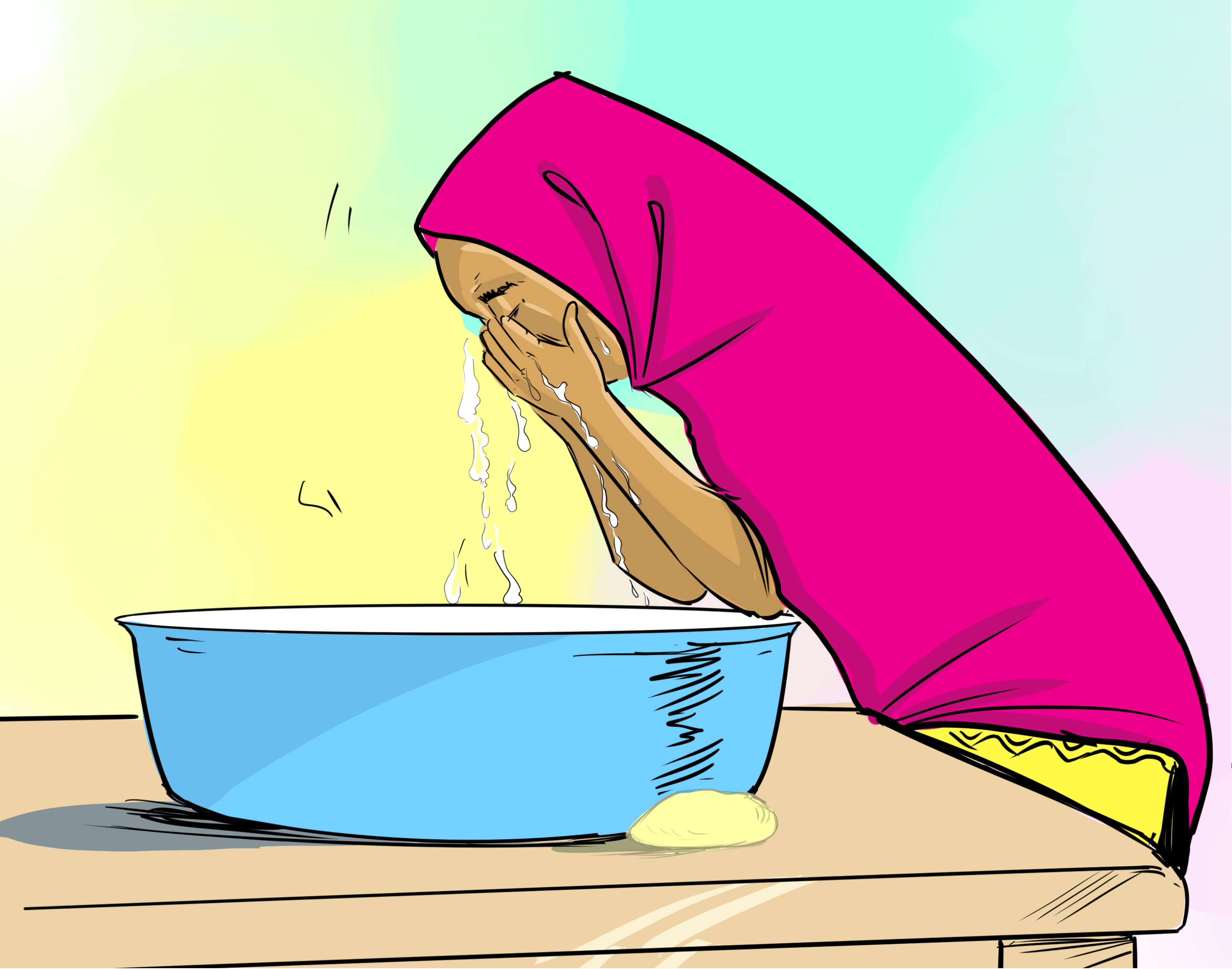
I jump out of bed.

soap and water.



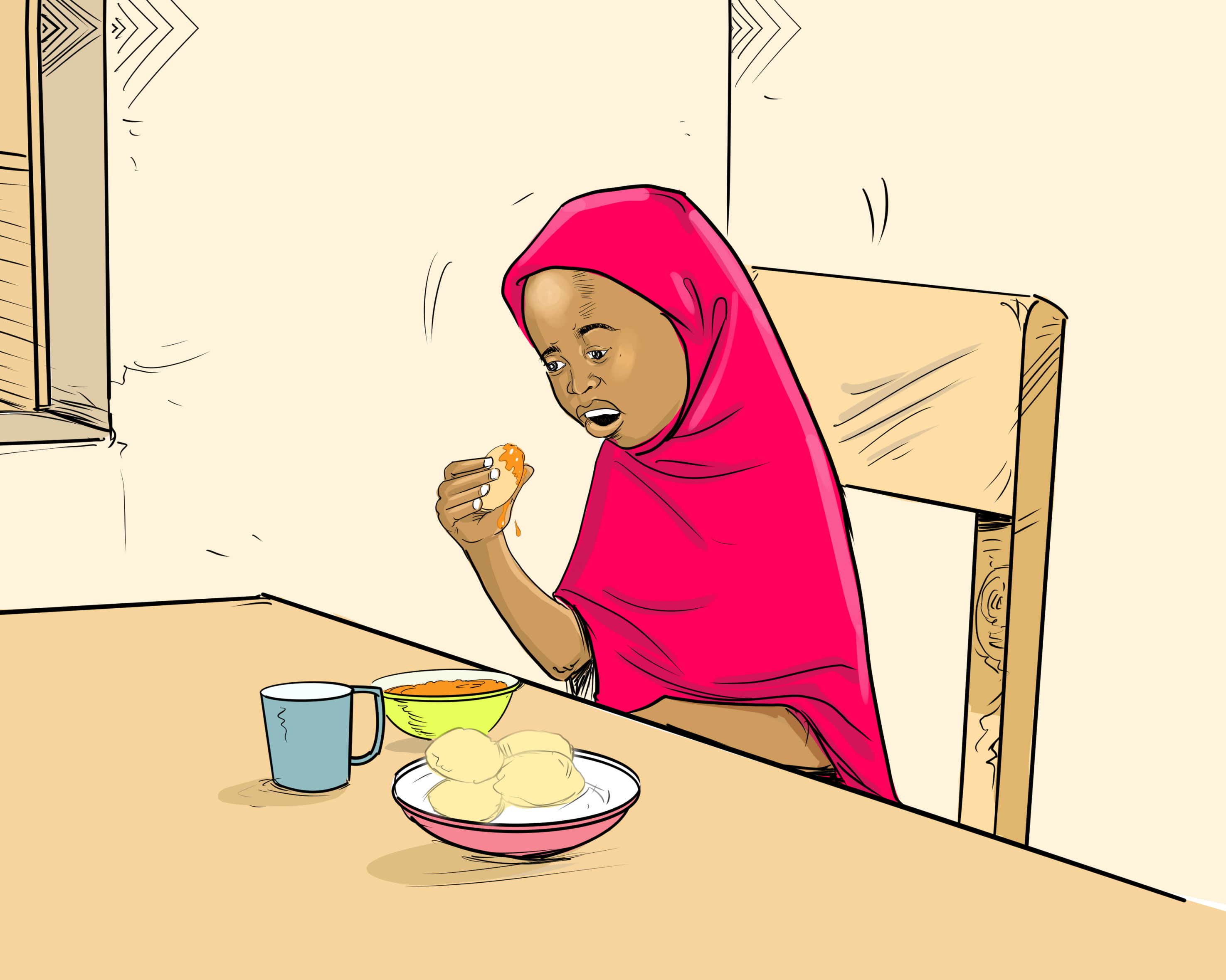
I wash my toes with

soap and water.

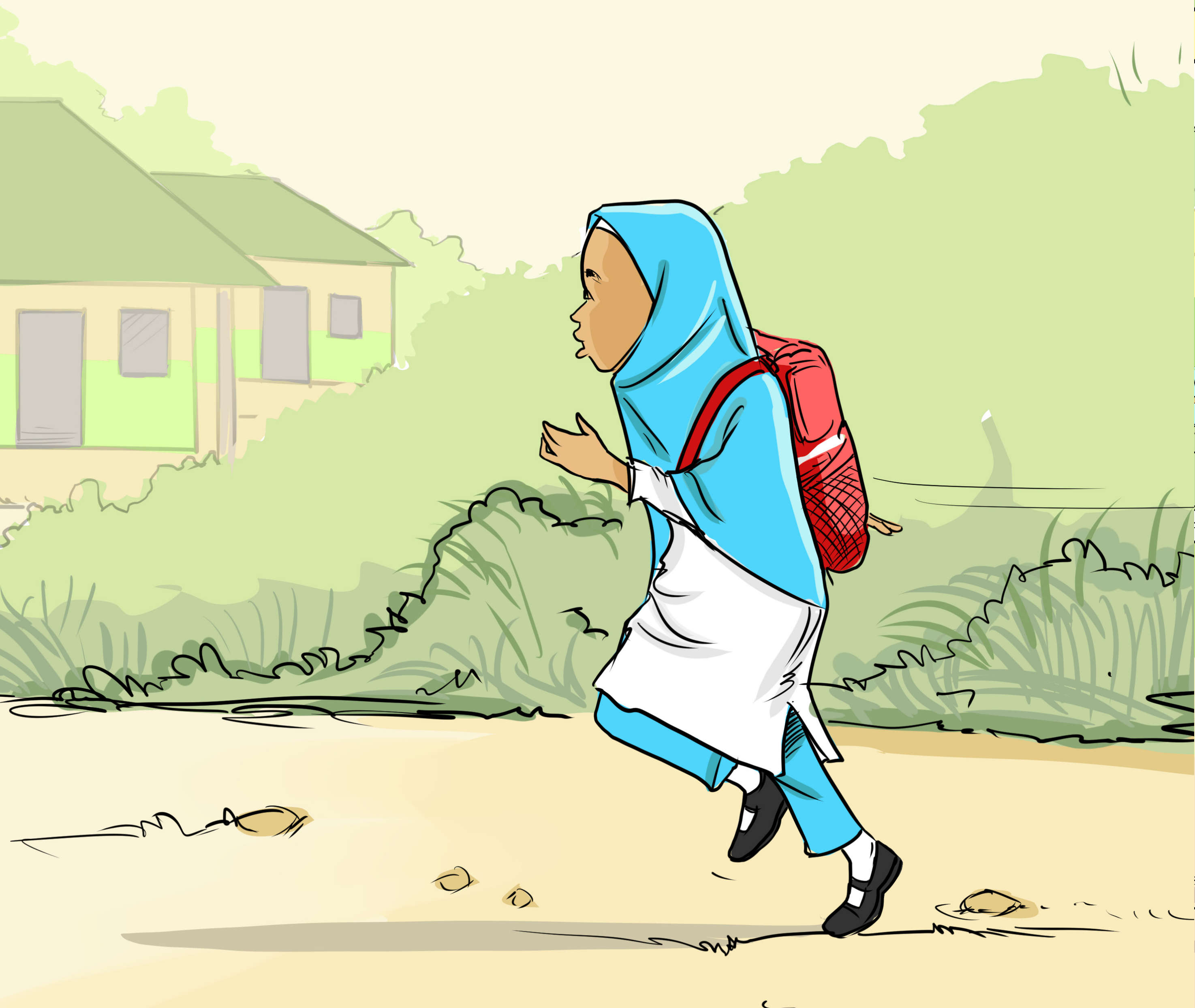

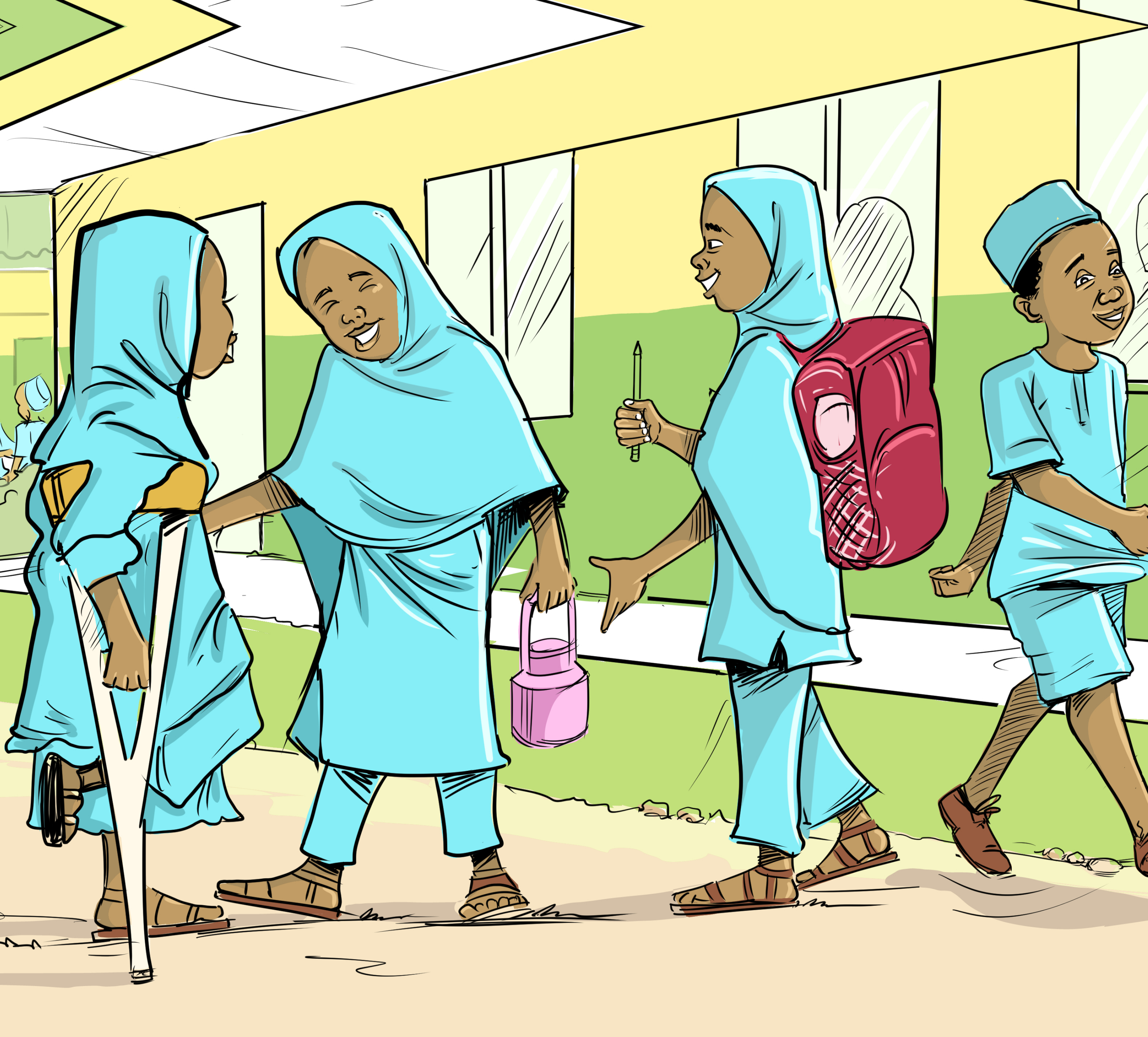
